109th Annual State Convention Banquet

The Knights and Honored Guests were welcomed by the Vice Mayor of Wichita, Jeff Longwell, Saint Francis of Assisi parishioner and member of Council 4118. He commented on one billion dollars to charity and four hundred million man hours the Knights of Columbus have donated over the last ten years.

Archbishop Emeritus James P. Keleher spoke of the importance of lay people. One example was the sacrifice of St. Juan Diego and Our Lady of Guadalupe referenced by Msgr. Chavez. He also talked of the appreciation of the support of priests and seminarians given by the Knights of Columbus.

Bishop Paul S. Coakley voiced his continuing appreciation for the Knights' outstanding support of vocations and spiritual

discernment, and reiterated, "The Knights are the right hand of the priests and bishops."

Bishop Michael O. Jackels spoke of the new translations for the missal for mass to take effect Advent 2011. It is a closer connection to scripture and prayer. He referenced the new translation, "My sacrifice and yours," to show both priests and congregation are co-celebrants of the Mass. This also emphasizes the quality of the sacrifice not the quantity of the sacrifice. "We share God's gifts to give glory to God and to help others." Mass ends with the command, "Go and do." We are to live for the honor of God and the benefit of others.

Opening Mass

The Celebrant and Homilist for the opening Mass of the 109th Convention was the Most Reverend James P. Keleher, Archbishop Emeritus of the Archdiocese of Kansas City. He was joined by State Chaplain Rev. David J. Metz, Monsignor Eduardo Chavez, former State Chaplain Rev. Tom Dolezal, and Rev. Regie Saldanha. The feast of the celebration was St. Joseph the Worker.

In his homily, the Archbishop shared that we all have vocations within our vocation and that God gives us the grace to fulfill these callings. All St. Joseph wanted was to get married and raise a family. He was ready to divorce Mary until God called him in a dream to the role of protector for the Holy Family. He is now the heavenly guide and protector of the Church.

Most members of the Knights of Columbus are also called to the primary vocation of being married to a wonderful woman and raising a family. The Archbishop noted that we also have a

vocation to be the lay advocate, guardian and protector of the Body of Christ on earth, the Church. We love the Church Universal and the Holy Father. We accept all of the teachings of the Catholic Church. We proclaim our love of the Eucharist, the sacredness of life in the womb, the dignity of natural death, marriage as a union between a man and a woman, that the family is the first church. We support our priests and seminarians. We protest the immorality of using human embryos for stem cell research. The Knights of Columbus proclaim to the world a moral code based on the Ten Commandments of God and the Precepts of the Church. We profess our love and devotion to Mary, the bride of St. Joseph. We support the charitable works of the Church. The Archbishop closed with thoughts from Mother Teresa that we are all called to do something beautiful for God and the world in the spirit of St. Joseph.

State Knight of the Year - Ray Kennedy



The 2009-10 State Knight of the Year is an exemplary model of what it means to be a Knight of Columbus and is often referred to as "Mr. Knight" by Fr. Wayne Schmid, his pastor. Raymond Kennedy has been a key member of Derby Council 4458 since 1968. During those years,

he held numerous council offices and volunteer positions. Following four years as District Deputy for District 32, Ray served the State Council as Pennies from Heaven Chairman for two years and the Community Activities Director for another two years. Ray was instrumental in establishing Bishop Mark K. Carroll Assembly 2138 and was the first Faithful Navigator for the Assembly. He is still an active member and serves on the Assembly's Color Guard. He has attended and participated in over one hundred First, Second and Third Degree Ceremonials and serves as the sound man on most Second and Third Degree ceremonials in south central Kansas.

In the late 1960's, Council 4458 purchased 80 acres of land near Derby and built a Council Clubhouse on the land. Ray managed the clubhouse from the beginning until 2005. Those

Our Kansas Knights of Columbus State Family of the Year, the Kent and Lori Linnebur Family, comes to us from St. Jude Parish in Wichita and St. Jude Council 12049. Kent and Lori will celebrate 30 years of marriage on May 17th and are the parents of five daughters and two sons.

Kent and Lori and their family are very active within their parish where Kent and Lori are both Extraordinary Ministers of Communion. Kent has been a mass lecturer for over 32 years and serves on the Parish Finance Committee. Lori is a past president of the Altar Society and also coordinated funeral dinners. For many years she has been a school room mother at St. Jude Catholic School and helps with extra school activities and functions. As a family, they have always supported Catholic

Education, as they have had one or more children in the St. Jude School for 22 consecutive years and all of their children have attended Bishop Carroll High School. Their youngest son, Scott, starts next year. Two of their daughters have taught CCD/PSR classes and both sons have participated in parish grounds upkeep and planting trees at the newly re-modeled church. Kent is past president of the Holy Name Club, which led to his being a charter member of the St. Jude Knights of Columbus Council. Kent and Lori also serve the Diocese of Wichita by serving on the Natural Family Planning and Family Life Advisory Board.

Kent has been a member of the Knights of Columbus for over 20 years and is an insurance member. He has been the council's Pro-Life Chairman multiple terms over the past ten years. He and Lori are very active with Pro-Life activities and together they have championed the annual January Pro-Life Baby Shower where newborn clothing, diapers and formula can be dropped off before and after the masses, then delivered to local charities. Kent is also a past president of Kansas for Life. Most of their children have attended the March-for-Life in Washington, D.C. Their two sons help at Pro-Life and Vocations support breakfasts and the children have also participated in many K of C Pro-Life Essay Contests. Kent also served his council as the Vocations Chairman, vigorously pursuing seminarian support during his tenure. His late brother, Fr. David Linnebur, was a Wichita diocesan priest. Kent and Lori have been selected as Family of the Month by the council each of the past four years and Kent also has been selected Knight of the Month several times.

Kent, along with his family, has worked the Tootsie Roll fund drives and the St. Jude K of C sponsored Christmas tree lot for many years. All of his (eligible) children participated in many of the K of C Free Throw Championships since the council began 13 years ago. Kent rarely misses a Corporate Communion Mass. As you can see, Lori and the kids have greatly supported Kent in his K of C activities and have made the Knights of Columbus a "family affair."

Kent is a master electrician. He and Lori started Linnebur Electric 28 years ago. Lori, works in the office for their business and is a very busy homemaker as well. Kent is secretary for the Independent Electrical Contractors Association and is a past treasurer of the local "Pheasants Forever," a conservation organization.

The whole family has been active in the community as he and his older son have volunteered whenever needed for electrical repairs at The Guadalupe Clinic. The family also volunteers at the The Lord's Diner. All five of their daughters have volunteered for as much as two years each as teen nurse's aids at Via Christi-St. Francis Hospital. Kent's idea of volunteering is, "Call me for anything you need help with. I'll be glad to!"

As mentioned earlier, Kent and Lori have five daughters and two sons: Donna, Martha, Tammi, Steve, Teresa, Angela

and Scott. They also have four grandchildren.

Their daughter, Donna, and husband Chris Snook have one child and are members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish in Wichita. Daughter Martha and husband Trinity Muth have three children and are members of St. Mary's Parish in Newton, KS. Daughters Tammi and Teresa live in Overland Park, KS and are working and going to college. Son Steve is a Journeyman electrician working for Linnebur Electric and lives in Wichita. Daughter Angela is a junior at Bishop Carroll High School and plans to go to college and study art. Son Scott is in 8th grade at St. Jude School and loves sports and hunting with his dad. All seven kids have played basketball and have been involved in sports in high school.

duties involved overseeing the numerous activities the council hosted and catered. In addition, he mowed the grounds as well as the other duties required to keep the property well maintained. Ray has served as Council Activities Chairman for over twenty years. He is the "go to" guy to organize workers for their many activities, including the council's main fundraiser which is hosting "Casino Nights" throughout south central Kansas.

Fr. Schmid became the pastor of St. Mary Parish twelve years ago. He says, "From day one of my arrival, Ray Kennedy was out in front in terms of support, encouragement and commitment in assisting as the parish and I addressed the challenges facing us. Ray was instrumental in the success our parish achieved." Fr. Schmid also said he believed Ray was a "primary mover" in the Knights decision to donate 30 acres of the council's land that enabled the parish to move their total parish facility to its current site and later an additional 40 acres of land to help pay for the new school. Ray served as chairman for the "Pitching the Tent" fundraising campaign in 2005 to build the new Faith Center for St. Mary Parish.

On the community level, Ray has been a key organizer and supporter of the council's annual Tootsie Roll Drives. He helped organize the council's participation and assistance with the Holy Family Camp. He is an active member of the Kansas Farm Bureau and served two years as the president of Sedgwick County Farm Bureau.

Ray has actively supported the council's efforts to establish a Squires Circle for young Catholic men from the Derby, Rose Hill and Mulvane areas. This dream was realized when a Circle was established March 4 of this year. One of Ray's grandsons serves as an adult leader for the new group.

Ray served his country in World War II. Upon his return, he lived on the family farm north of Derby with his wife Tommie. They have been married 62 years raising seven children, and have 22 grandchildren and 24 great grandchildren. Ray and Tommie have been recognized as the council's Family of the Month numerous times because of their continuous support of the parish and council. Two of their sons, a son-in-law, a grandson-in-law and three grandsons are current members of Derby Council #4458.

Grand Knight John Washburn has this to say about Ray: "Ray Kennedy may be the most recognized member of the Knights of Columbus in south central Kansas. He has been an important ambassador for the Knights of Columbus for forty-two years. He continually lives the life of Catholic Stewardship and is a role model for every member of our council."

Insurance Agency Awards

Once again the Knights of Columbus insurance program continues to grow and set new records. The Knights of Columbus Insurance program now has over \$75 billion of insurance in force worldwide with almost \$2 billion of that total here in Kansas. Last year our Kansas agencies issued approximately \$252 million of life insurance on members and their families.

Our full time agency staff continues to grow and to work with the council officers in membership growth. Two field agents were recognized in the area of membership development. Joseph Cummings of the Eastern Agency was awarded 1st place recruiter and Wade Greif of the Central Agency received the 2nd place award.

The 2009-2010 fraternal year has brought about a new life insurance product to better meet the needs of our members and families. The order introduced a Survivorship Universal Life policy designed to address estate planning needs and charitable giving opportunities. This past year, the Supreme Council sponsored the first ever summer sales conference for Field Agents. It was held in St. Louis, MO. The Kansas agencies were well represented at the conference with 19 Field Agents and 3 General Agents attending. The 2010 conference will be held in Dallas, TX in July of 2010.

Justin Deges and Darin Reed of the Western Kansas Agency have qualified for the prestigious Million Dollar Round Table (MDRT). The MDRT recognition is awarded to only 5% of all life insurance agents, both fraternal and commercial worldwide.

The Western Kansas Agency was recognized this year for finishing 9th in the order in life insurance sales. The Eastern Kansas Agency finished 19th. It is an honor to have two agencies from Kansas recognized in the top 20 of all agencies in the order.
